Moody's Announces Completion of a Periodic Review of Ratings of CleanPowerSF

SAN FRANCISCO – The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission is pleased to announce Moody's completion of a periodic review of CleanPowerSF and affirmation of CleanPowerSF's A2 credit rating. Moody's key rating considerations are summarized below:

CleanPowerSF's A2 rating is underpinned by the strength of its service area, the CCA's ownership by San Francisco (City & County of) CA (Aaa), San Francisco Public Utilities Commission, CA's (SFPUC: Aa2) long-standing experience operating large utility enterprises with energy procurement, a common pool of experienced employees, as well as access to the unrestricted portion of the city's general fund liquidity pool in the case of an emergency. CleanPowerSF is a single jurisdiction CCA, rather than a joint power agency (JPA) CCA.

Despite the strong socio-economic conditions of CleanPowerSF's service area, a core underpinning of the CleanPowerSF's credit profile, the service territory includes a large commercial customer segment making CleanPowerSF disproportionally negatively impacted by the Shelter in Place (SIP) measures associated with COVID 19 from December 2020 to July 2021. CleanPowerSF anticipates load demand recovery of up to 95% of pre-COVID levels will be reached in FY 2022, as it has conservatively assumed a slow recovery and has not yet adjusted potential demand increase from wider adoption of electric vehicles.

The credit quality further considers CleanPowerSF's limited operating history, the lack of tested regulations for California CCAs, and the challenges associated with managing power procurement risks with intermittent resources.
